Purpose: To promote an introductory, competitive experience for the beginning skater, the Excel skater, including IJS Elements events, and a fun experience for all levels as they perform a theatrical routine.

Entries: All Entries <u>must be received</u> online through EMS no later than Saturday, March 9, 2024 (see details below).

Series Information: This competition has been approved by U.S. Figure Skating as part of the 2024 Excel Series and approved for the 2024 Skate Colorado Compete USA.

<u>Excel Series Information</u>





General Rules: This event will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the <u>current rulebook</u>, and/or current Compete USA handbook as well as any pertinent updates that have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating <u>website</u>. Requirements will be those designated for the 2023-24 competitive season. All other rules will be outlined in this announcement. The competition is open to all skaters who are eligible members of U.S. Figure Skating. All skaters must compete at the same level in all events. This competition will be judged using the 6.0 system of judging or IJS where indicated.

Please Note: If space is available, late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the registrar and the chief referee. A \$35 late entry fee will be assessed. Entry form changes made after the entry closing date will be assessed a \$30 change fee (\$50 the week of the competition if approved by the Chief Referee). PLEASE CHECK YOUR ENTRY CAREFULLY WITH YOUR COACH BEFORE ENTERING. Changes requested after the entry deadline may be made at the discretion of the competition committee and are NOT guaranteed. Anyone not submitting their PPC and music by March 21st will be assessed a \$30 administrative fee each that will be collected online or at the registration desk before the skater is allowed to skate.

General Information

Age Requirements - All ages are as of April 13, 2024. All event levels follow the age restrictions in the current USFS Rulebook unless new age restrictions will be in effect.

The committee reserves the right to limit the number of entries due to time constraints and to combine male and female skaters when needed to have an event. In Showcase events, where no competition exists at a level, levels may be combined. Music for the free skating portion of all divisions must be provided by skater and submitted on the website. Backup music must be available rink side should unexpected issues occur.

All skaters must be full members of US Figure Skating. There will be no refunds after close of entries.

Test Level

As of December 1, 2022, singles athletes may opt to accelerate their test progression within U.S. Figure Skating and thus compete at level(s) best suited for their technical skillset. Athletes must still meet the minimum requirements for each level and additionally, if participating within the National Qualifying Series (NQS) or National Excel Series (Excel), they will establish a <u>competitive floor</u> (i.e., the lowest level they can compete at).

The <u>competitive floor</u> is determined only by the level selected through the EMS Series Application for NQS or Excel and is not uniquely tied to competition registration (regardless of series participation).

Example, if an athlete passed their junior free skate test in November and competed in the 2022-23 NQS as a Novice from July - September, they may register for either novice or junior in excel or well-balanced events. The novice level will remain their competitive floor until they complete an EMS Series Application at the junior level or higher for NQS or Excel.

Example #2, if an athlete passed their juvenile free skate but has not competed in NQS or Excel (i.e., they have not established a competitive floor), they have the option to compete pre-preliminary – intermediate (if skate up is permitted). While the options are wide, U.S. Figure Skating entrusts the coach to guide the athlete to the select the appropriate level for the athlete based on their technical skillset.

Eligibility Notes:

The singles free skate test levels will remain as a minimum requirement to compete.

Athletes may not skate down in any event.

This update does NOT apply to Adult, Showcase and Solo Dance.

For synchronized skating teams, moves-in-the-field test requirements are as of the entry deadline.

Facilities

The Apex Ice Center has 2 indoor ice surfaces, each measuring 200' x 85' with rounded edges. An Aquatic Center (3 swimming pools with slides and play area), exercise facilities. Spectator seating is available. No admission will be charged for entrance into the ice rinks.

Video/Photo

We are not planning to have either service available. We will provide a backdrop and awards stands so that parents can video and photograph their own children. We will be providing a livestream of the competition.

U.S. Figure Skating, Alpine Skating Club and The Apex Ice Center accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

Locker Rooms and Changing Areas

Locker rooms and changing areas will NOT be available for use. No changing will be permitted in the restrooms. Please arrive at the arena dressed and ready to skate

Important Notice for All Coaches

To be a credentialed coach at a sanctioned nonqualifying competition, coaches must meet the following requirements:

Coaching U.S. Figure Skating athletes:

- U.S. Figure Skating Full Membership (either through a member club or as an individual)
- Completion of the U.S. Center for SafeSport's online SafeSport™ Training
- Successfully pass a bi-seasonal background check (includes automatic recheck at the 12month mark)
- Agree to the U.S. Figure Skating Code of Ethics
- Verification of liability insurance
- Completion of CER Courses (administered via PSA)
- Agree to Waivers and Release
- Agree to Medical Consent
- Agree to Name and Likeness Release

Coaching Compete USA athletes:

- Learn to Skate USA Instructor membership OR U.S. Figure Skating full membership
- Completion of the U.S. Center for SafeSport's online SafeSport™ Training (18 years and older)
- Successfully pass a bi-seasonal background check (includes automatic recheck at the 12-month mark) (18 years and older)
- Learn to Skate USA Instructor Certification completed OR U.S. Figure Skating compliant coach (for coaches under 18 years old)

*SafeSport training is available through www.usfsaonline.org for full members of U.S. Figure Skating (through Learn to Skate USA portal for instructors). There is no cost to this training. The LOC will have a list of compliant coaches who are approved to receive a credential at the competition. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. to receive a credential.

If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D. and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential. There can be no exceptions to this policy. If a foreign coach has only foreign athletes at your competition, a background check and SafeSport Training is not required. Instead, the coach must submit a letter from their Federation stating they are a member in good standing.

Mandatory Athletes

Athletes age 18+ as of the competition start date who will be competing on a team (i.e., synchro, ice dance, pairs, shadow dance, theatre, etc.) with at least one Minor Athlete must complete SafeSportTM Training. *

Minor athletes who turn 18 mid-season are encouraged to seek parental consent to take the online SafeSportTM Training early to avoid any disruptions in their ability to participate as the training is required upon turning 18. The athlete will not be SkateSafe compliant until they have completed the training and their Members Only portal reflects completion. Please email skatesafe@usfigureskating.org for instructions or questions regarding parental consent

Practice Ice

Pre-Purchase Selection: After the practice ice schedule has been posted, skaters that have pre-purchased practice ice credits will have a chance to select their UPI sessions via EMS. An email will be sent to all skaters that purchased credits through pre-purchase 48 hours and 1 hour before the selection window opens. Skaters that still have available credits 12 hours prior to the session selection deadline, they will receive a reminder email to login to their account and use their sessions. The fee for each 30 minutes session will be \$20 per skater/singles/pairs/duets. Music will NOT be played. Maximum of 2 Practice Ice Session may be requested per skater per eligible event. ASC reserves the right to cancel or change any practice session. All practice ice should be requested and paid for during on line registration. Practice Ice will be selected by skater. Additional sessions may become available during the day as our schedule permits.

Awards

Presentation of awards will immediately follow the posting of results. Medals will be awarded to 1st through 4th place finishers in all events with the exception of the Pre-Preliminary and below events which will award medals to 1st through 6th place.

PARTNERED EVENTS - Shadow Dance/Artistic Duets

Only one partner will complete registration for the team. During the registration process, you will be asked to identify your partner and verify their test information. The registered partner will be responsible for managing all aspects of the competition for the team including music/PPC upload, practice ice sales, etc.

EMS REGISTRATION (Synchro & TOI Teams):

All teams are required to register online via the U.S. Figure Skating Event Management System (EMS). Anyone listed as a team manager or coach for a team in their Members Only Team Profile will be able to access the registration system. Registration for the competition is not considered final until online payment has been received. Online payment via credit card is the only form of accepted payment for registration in EMS.

- 3. Click the BLUE "EMS Event Management System" button.
- 4. Choose "Competition Registration Teams" from the menu.
- 5. Select the team you would like to register for competition.

- 7. Walk through the on-screen registration process which will include:

- also be updated from your EMS Team Portal. You will only be able to add coaches who are listed in your Team Profile.
- 6. <u>Team Service Personnel Information</u>: Click the "**Add Team Service Personnel**" to add attending team service personnel. The screen will display team managers and team service personnel listed in your Team Profile. Check the box next to each name to add them. Only the team service personnel who will be attending this competition should be listed. This information can also be updated from your EMS Team Portal. You will only be able to add team service personnel who are listed in your Team Profile.
- 8. Payment via credit card will be required to complete your registration as it is the only accepted form of payment for registration in EMS. Registrations are not considered complete until an invoice confirmation via email has been received. A 3% processing fee will be assessed at check-out

NOTE: Payment must be submitted individually for each team's registration. If you are planning on registering multiple teams in a short period of time, it is recommended that you contact your credit card company to prevent anti-fraud systems from being activated.

MUSIC SUBMISSION/UPLOAD

Competitors participating in events with music are required to upload their music to EMS no later than March 21, 2024 by 11:59pm ET. After this date, skaters/teams will be locked out of this feature and a \$30 late fee will automatically be added to each skater's/team's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

Competitors must also have available a backup copy of their competition music on a cell phone and it must be immediately available rinkside whenever the skater competes. If the phone does not have the standard round headset connector, an appropriate adapter, such as an Apple Lightning connector or Samsung USB-C adapter is required to be attached. The phone should be presented to the music person with the file ready to play, phone in airplane mode and volume turned to maximum.

points for a final standing. <u>Trophies and medals will be awarded at the Skate Colorado Compete USA competition</u> at the 2024 Colorado Springs Invitational.

Skate Colorado Compete USA Series Team Banner $(3x4) - 1^{\circ}$, 2° , and 3° place banners will be awarded to the club/skating school with the most points scored throughout the entire series (all 10 competitions) by skaters representing that club/skating school (points for clubs and skating schools located at the same rink will be added together to enhance and create more of a "team" concept). Points will be awarded based upon the same system as the individual points. Only the top 10 team members' OVERALL scores FOR THE ENTIRE SEASON (including move up points) will count toward the team points for the determination of the team trophy. Tie breakers will be the same as the individual tie breakers.

Free Skate Program and Elements/Compulsory Series Point System

A skater must enter BOTH the Free skate Program AND the Elements/Compulsory event IN THE SAME LEVEL in each of at least TWO (2) of the 10 registered Skate Colorado Compete USA Competitions to be eligible for accumulating points. Skaters must compete in a minimum of TWO (2) competitions. Only up to the best 4 scores (free skate and compulsory/elements added together) of the season will be totaled for the final score in the series. Each event will have a maximum of six skaters. Both youth and adults may accumulate points!

The system for scoring points for the trophies will be as follows:

1st place	6 points
2 nd place	5 points
3rd place	4 points
4 th place	3 points
5 th place	2 points
6 th place	1 point

* A skater will earn three points toward their overall standing each time the skaters competes in a level that is higher than the level competed in at the previous competition throughout the duration of the series. In order to keep the extra three points he/she must compete in that level or higher in all subsequent competitions. Move up points will be awarded for events 2-9 in the series (even though the event point scores may not be one of the final four best scores).

In the event that there is only one skater in an event, the skater will have the choice to skate alone OR move up a level to compete against other skaters, HOWEVER, THE SKATER WILL HAVE TO MOVE UP IN BOTH THE ELEMENTS/COMPULSORY MOVES AND THE PROGRAMS W/MUSIC EVENTS. In this case, those skaters will be allowed to move back to their original level to compete at the next competition and shall not be awarded the 3 point move up credit.

If an event has 2-6 skaters, the points will be awarded as if there were six skaters in the group. If there is only one skater in the group, that skater will be awarded three points.

In case of a tie, the total number of skaters that the competitor has skated against throughout the series (all competitions and not just the competitions with the 4 best scores) will be the 1st tie breaker. The total score for all free skate events during the season will be the 2nd tie breaker, the total score for all compulsory events during the season will be the 3rd tie breaker, and the number of levels increased throughout the season will be the 4th tie breaker.

All points follow the skater throughout the series, so if a skater moves up to higher levels, the points follow the skater. Once a skater moves up a level, they may not compete at a lower level unless they moved up as a result of having no other skaters in their group.

Trophies will be awarded 1-3 in each level from Snowplow Sam through Free Skate 6 and Adult 1-6. The trophies will be awarded to the skaters at their level as of the last competition in which they compete.

Rules and Format:

COMPETITION ANNOUNCEMENT

The Skate Colorado Compete USA Series is sponsored equally by the 10 participating ice rinks and/or U.S. Figure Skating member clubs. Competition packages will be available at all participating ice rinks and/or via the club or rink websites. Each competition will have its own entry forms and specific rules so please make sure to read the entire announcement for each competition.

ELIGIBILITY RULES FOR PARTICIPANTS

The competition is open to ALL skaters who are current eligible (ER 1.00) members of either the Learn to Skate USA Program and/or are full members of U.S. Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete but must be registered with the host Learn to Skate USA Program/Club or any other Learn to Skate USA Program/Club.

Eligibility will be based on skill level as of the closing date of entries.

All Snowplow Sam through Basic 6 skaters are eligible to skate at highest level passed OR one level higher BUT not both levels in the same event during the same competition and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dances.

All Aspire 1 - 4 may compete at the level that best fits their skill level and may NOT have passed the USFS Preliminary Singles test.

It is very important to the success of the series that skaters are placed in the correct divisions. If, for whatever reason, the local organizing committee and/or their Chief Referee discover that a skater has been placed in a category that is below their class level, the chair and referee will have the option to move the skater to the proper division, even if this has to be done the day of the competition. This will ensure that every event is as fair as possible to the competitors.

Elements: Snowplow Sam – Basic 6

Format: Each skater will perform one element at a time (in program format) in the <u>order listed below</u> (no excessive connecting steps or choreography)

- To be skated on ½ ice, no music
- · All elements must be skated in the order listed no additional elements are allowed
- · The skater must demonstrate the required elements as described
- · Each element may only be attempted once
- Time: 1:00 MAX

Compulsory: Aspire 1-4 and Adults 1-6
